The Administration on Aging (AoA) will hold a competition for 6-8 cooperative agreements to demonstrate how existing evidence-based service delivery research programs targeting persons with AD and related dementias (ADRD) or their caregivers can be translated into useful programs that can be administered at a reasonable cost at the community level through the Aging Services Network.
