Happy Retirement, Dr. Fitzgerald!





In his short time here, Jake has improved the tinnitus and sound intolerance care by creating the Progressive Tinnitus Management (PTM) group. This program was established at the National Center for Rehabilitative Auditory research and is backed by years of research from Dr. James Henry and other Veterans Health Administration researchers. Our PTM program is now one of the only ones in the entire world that provides progressive tinnitus management to civilian (non-veteran) patients. The goal of this group is to provide education and strategies to help better manage physical and emotional reactions to the tinnitus and improve quality of life. This is a rare opportunity for tinnitus and hyperacusis patients and has led to them coming in and pursuing treatment, all thanks to the program Jake created here and leads with the help of **Monique Marcus**.

In his new role, Jake will continue to re-educate, update, and lead the tinnitus team as well as other providers toward a more whole health focused, best patient care which will improve tinnitus care and increase patient access and satisfaction. We are grateful that Jake will lead us in improving quality of life for patients experiencing tinnitus, hyperacusis, misophonia and other related auditory conditions.


Otolaryngology Events: Looking Back

The Fall Voice Conference is designed to encourage and educate professionals on a multi-disciplinary approach to the

management of vocal disorders. The focus of this conference is the clinical care of patients with voicerelated difficulties and how clinical and basic science research guide clinical care.







The 4th annual Women in Otolaryngology dinner was hosted at Jefferson on October 18, 2023. There was a tremendous turnout of otolaryngologists from across our region, including many current and former Jefferson trainees. Elina Toskala, MD, PhD, MBA and Colin Huntley, MD attended the International Otolaryngology Underwater Update course in Jamaica from October 24-27, 2023. Dr. Toskala was one of the course directors and gave a talk on Allergy Management for Otolaryngologists as well as chaired two sessions, and Dr. Huntley gave lectures on Perioperative Management of Sleep Apnea patients and CPAP Use After Nasal Surgery.

> Lauren Lucas, AuD attended the 2023 Fall International Cochlear Implant Meeting from October 23-25, 2023 in Santa Rosa Beach, FL. The meeting consisted of a 3-day panel and lecture-based material fostering peer-to-peer discussion amongst the country's top neurotologic surgeons and audiologists regarding cochlear



implants. This meeting is clinically focused on current practices and innovations in research regarding cochlear implantation. Dr. Lucas served on the panel "Candidacy vs. Medical Necessity," discussing barriers that clinicians and patients encounter in the process of getting cochlear implants approved for those who would benefit from this technology.



Marc Rosen, MD and James Evans, MD (neurosurgery faculty) traveled to Houston, TX to serve as visiting professors for the Annual MD Anderson Skull Base Course which was held on November 4, 2023.

Jacob Hunter, MD, Jim Han, MD (PGY5), Chase Kahn, MD (PGY4), Jena Patel, MD (PGY4) and Aarti Agarwal, MD (PGY5) attended a two-day ear dissection course which was hosted by Medtronic. The course provided residents from across the country with a cadaver for middle ear dissection using an endoscope. Participants also practiced tympanoplasty and ossiculoplasty techniques. Another day was devoted to drilling the temporal bone, isolating the facial nerve, practicing cochlear implantation insertions, and opening the internal auditory canal. These sessions were complemented by didactic lectures that outlined the procedures to be performed in the lab and showcased various cases and techniques from an internationally recognized faculty.







David Cognetti, MD was in Cincinnati on November 4, 2023 for the Donald Schumrick Head and Neck Cancer Lectureship. Dr. Cognetti was able to catch up with several friends of the department including Drs. Alice Tang, Chad Zender, and Dave Steward. Dr. Shumrick's son Kevin is an Otolaryngologist and Kevin's son Chris was one of our earliest research fellows in 2016! Chris has completed his residency and is currently doing a clinical fellowship in Texas.

2023 Thyroid Cancer Symposium: Updates in the Diagnosis and Treatment

The biennial Thyroid Cancer Symposium was held on Friday, November 17, 2023. While the course was virtual, there was a "watch party" at 925 Chestnut Street where our residents, research fellows and other interested staff attended together. More than 60 healthcare professionals from across the country attended the course which included a comprehensive and current update in the diagnosis and management of thyroid nodules and thyroid cancer. The presentations were a combination of evidence-based medicine and clinical experience, patient cases and clinical findings. There were also expert panel discussions designed to help inform practice decisions on complex clinical cases.

Elizabeth Cottrill, MD served as co-course director along with Jeffrey Miller, MD of Endocrinology, while David Cognetti, MD, Christopher Fundakowski, MD, Edmund Pribitkin, MD, MBA and Kathleen Tibbetts, MD served as course faculty.

Understanding physician-patient factors associated with RAI use

- The interplay between physicians and patients in determining RAI use remains understudied, and yet critically important to tailoring care.
- We asked surveyed patients to identify the endocrinologists and surgeons involved in thyroid cancer management.
- The physician survey data was merged with the patient survey data resulting in 2,661 patient-physician pairs (some patients identified a surgeon and an endocrinologist)
