SELECTING A TARGET JOURNAL

Unsure where to submit your next manuscript for publication? Try JournalGuide.com, a free tool that gives you a simple way to identify target journals. You can use your manuscript title, abstract, or keywords to find journals that have published articles on similar topics. The database also provides details on individual journals, including where they are indexed, publication fees (if any), and average time from submission to decision and publication.
