

EMS Instructor Position Job Description

Primary Function:

The EMS Instructor is responsible for providing training and education in one or more of the following:

- Advanced Cardiac Life Support
- Pediatric Advanced Life Support
- Emergency Medical Technician Programs
- Paramedic Programs

All programs are held on Jefferson's Campus and some offsite facilities. The EMS Instructor is not permanently assigned to a class or group of students, but rather occasionally lectures and presents materials on a particular topic or subject matter that they are certified or experienced in teaching. The Instructor may be asked to take part in special projects or create a power point presentation on a specific topic that is assigned by a Manager or Course Coordinator.

Requirements:

The candidate must have a High School Diploma or GED. Be able to have a flexible schedule including evenings or weekend availability. Have some knowledge or use of Microsoft Word, Excel, and Power Point. The candidate must have an active license and in good standing in one of the following: EMT, Paramedic, Nurse or Physician. The candidate must have certification as an instructor and be an advanced provider in ACLS and PALS (Paramedic, Nurse or Physician only). EMS Instructors can be a basic or advanced provider. EMS Instructor candidates must have a valid EMS Instructor certification. Some travel involved.

The Instructor candidate will required to instruct a lecture or teach a practical skills session as part of the selection process.

Experience:

The candidate must have prior teaching experience in the discipline in which the Instructor is teaching. You also must have three years experience as a healthcare provider in an acute or EMS related field.
