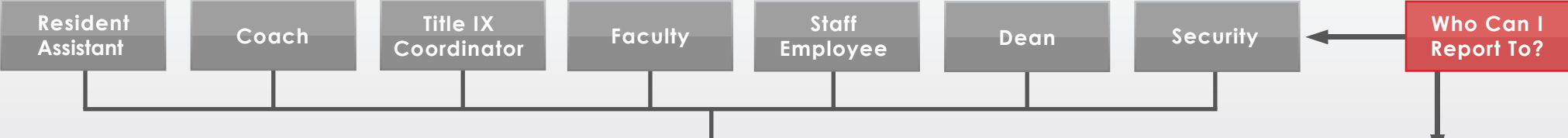


How To Report An Act of Sexual Violence



Title IX Coordinator
Definiton:
 Title IX protects any person from sex-based discrimination. Female, male and gender non-conforming students, faculty and staff are protected from any form of sex-based discrimination, harrasment or violence. The Title IX Coordinator is the Dean of Students and they are responsible for compliance.

- assess the immediate safety & well-being
- gather basic facts
- notify of right to contact law enforcement & seek medical treatment
- notify of importance of preservation of evidence
- enter into daily crime log
- assess for timely warning
- identify resources
- offer accomodations
- provide process options
- assess for pattern
- ascertain complaints wishes
- discuss barriers to proceeding
- evaluate individuals vs. campus safety
- assign advocate/support person
