2023-2024 APPLICANTS AND ENROLLED STUDENTS REPORT

APPLICANTS

Over the cycle of 2022 through 2024 Fall, **349 individuals** have initiated or submitted applications for graduate studies in the Community and Trauma Counseling (CTC) program at Thomas Jefferson University. Of such, 249 applicants voluntarily withdrew their applications at some point during the accordant admissions cycle. These 349 applicants did not include track-up students who proceeded to the CTC program upon completion of their undergraduate studies at Thomas Jefferson University.

Of the 98 applicants after the 249 applicants were taken out of consideration, 13 applicants decided to defer to the next year's enrollment while 5 applicants were denied for enrollment this year. As a result, 79 applicants were enrolled while, of such, **57 applicants** were enrolled into a master's program in the Community and Trauma Counseling program. Of the 98 applicants, 83.8% identified as female while 14.1% reported as male. 48.5% identified as White, Black or African American (19.2%), Hispanic of any race (10.1%), Asian (10%), American Indian or Alaska Native (1%), and two or more races (5.1%).




Figure 1. Self-Identified Permanent City of Residence




Figure 2. Self-Identified Permanent State of Residence

The applicants varied in permanent city and region (i.e., state or jurisdiction of the United States) of residence by self-report. Specifically, the diverse cities (see Figure 1) and diverse regions (see Figure 2) were reported among the 98 applicants while 36.4 % identified Philadelphia City as permanent city of residence, and 67.7% and 13.1% as Pennsylvania and New Jersey, respectively, as permanent region of residence.

Of the 98 applicants, 58.16% or 57 individuals has been enrolled at the time the admissions and enrollment data were released. Furthermore, these individuals have been confirmed the acceptance and enrolled in the CTC program at the time this report was written. However, it is important to report that these 98 applicants did not include the track-up students who entered the CTC program upon graduation from their undergraduate program.

ENROLLED STUDENTS

The enrollment information described in this report was based on the admissions raw data that did not include the track-up students who entered the CTC program either this past Summer or 2-2024 Pre-Fall. Of **the 40 enrolled students**, 52.5% identified as White, Black or African American (22.5%), Hispanic of any race (7.5%), and two or more races (2.5%). Moreover, 87.5% of the 40 enrolled students identified as female while 12.5% reported as male in relation to sex given at birth.

The enrolled students varied in permanent city and region (i.e., state or jurisdiction of the United States) of residence by self-report. Of the 40 enrolled students, 42.5% identified Philadelphia City as permanent city of residence, and 65.5% and 15% Pennsylvania and New Jersey, respectively, as permanent region of residence.
