

The Schiewer laboratory is seeking a self-motivated individual with a strong background in molecular and translational cancer biology to join a new research team focused on genitourinary cancers (prostate, bladder). The laboratory is building a research portfolio that includes studies aimed at discovery of mechanisms of cancer development and progression.

We are interested in DNA repair, transcriptional regulation, and cell cycle control. The overarching goal is to make discoveries in the lab that have the potential to impact clinical management of disease. The team regularly interacts with laboratory-, clinical-, and population-focused researchers. The laboratory began in November of 2019, and we are seeking a postdoctoral fellow.

The fellow will be expected to lead independent research projects, develop collaborations, present research findings at conferences, and author manuscripts submitted to peer-reviewed journals. All team members have the opportunity to gain mentorship while addressing critical questions in biomedical research. Furthermore, team members will gain experiences and develop skill sets for next career stages, as well as have access to world-class scientists and clinicians.
