Gynecology – Methodist Hospital (MHD)

This rotation is on the inpatient GYN service at Methodist Hospital. The resident will primarily perform surgical procedures and respond to hospital consultation requests.

Goals:

- 1. Provide compassionate and effective pre-operative, intra-operative and post-operative care to gynecologic patients. (PC, MK)
- 2. Function effectively on a team with other gynecologists, nurses, anesthesia and hospital personnel. (SBP, IC)
- 3. Review outcomes of clinical care and address opportunities for improvement, specifically by completing a GYN guideline. (PBL, SBP)
- 4. Competently care for patients from a wide array of socioeconomic backgrounds and diverse ethnicities. (P, IC)
- 5. Teach learners to provide care at the appropriate level. (SBP, PC)

PGY4

Objectives:

Upon completion of the rotation the PGY4 resident will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate leadership in prioritizing and triaging all care for gynecologic patients, including an understanding of the role of ancillary personnel and other members of the health care team, available system resources, and concepts of team resource management.
- 2. Carry out all aspects of pre-operative, intra-operative and post-operative care, including management decisions as the primary physician, with appropriate supervision by the attending faculty.
 - a. This may include post-operative rounding, including weekends if patients require a high level of care.
- 3. Lead educational curriculum including standards of care and use of evidence-based medicine in the care of gynecologic patients.
- 4. Assess patients for pelvic floor dysfunction and participate in the surgical repair.
- 5. Respond to gynecologic emergencies.
- 6. Demonstrate the ability to supervise, direct and teach the members of the inpatient team and interact effectively with ancillary nursing and operating room staff.
- 7. Attend continuity clinic.
- 8. Complete a GYN guideline draft or revision for departmental use.
- 9. Reach the following EPAs:
 - a. Diagnostic endoscopy as instructor of junior colleagues
 - b. Perform vaginal hysterectomy with appropriate supervision.
 - c. Perform abdominal hysterectomy with appropriate supervision.
 - d. Perform laparoscopic hysterectomy with appropriate supervision.

Teaching Methods:

Teaching methods are through:

1. Daily discussion, evaluation and management of all patients with the attending physicians.

Evaluations:

- 1. Global faculty evaluation, peer evaluations, student evaluations, global nurse evaluations and MyTip Report evaluation.
- 2. Complete oral exam, which includes preparing case list of five cases for examination.
