



Congratulations to **Adam Luginbuhl**, **MD** and **Christine Eischen**, **PhD** on their recently awarded R01 grant award. Dr. Christine Eischen is a close collaborator from the Department of Cancer Biology and is the PI of this grant with Dr. Luginbuhl as Co-I. Their grant titled "Investigating a new vulnerability in oral squamous cell carcinoma" will investigate the effects of a novel targeted degrader on oral squamous cell carcinoma (OSCC) and new approaches to increase OSCC immunogenicity. Preliminary data has demonstrated a remarkable signal in cancer samples so far. This is a promising start and new avenue for continued collaborations.






