Jefferson Center for Interprofessional Practice and Education (JCIPE) invites you to submit abstracts for the 2021 *Interprofessional Care for the 21st Century* conference which will be held virtually on April 13, 15, and 17, 2021. The purpose of this conference is to showcase scholarly work and works in progress related to interprofessional education and/or collaborative practice.

GOALS/OBJECTIVES:

1. Describe assessment strategies for interprofessional education and collaborative practice as related to learners, patients, programs or systems.
2. Discuss approaches for preparing faculty and staff for interprofessional education and collaborative practice.
3. Explain the role of advocacy in advancing interprofessional education and collaborative practice.
4. Design sustainable interprofessional curricula bridging the classroom and clinical practice.
5. Apply strategies to engage patients as partners in developing new models of interprofessional education and care.

TRACKS:

The following broad tracks have been chosen for JCIPE 2021 conference in order to encourage a wide range of abstracts with the focus on improving health outcomes. Abstracts should represent research and/or programs to advance the fields of interprofessional education (IPE) and collaborative practice (CP).

PRESENTATION TYPES:

Please choose Research or Non-Research.

- **Research Focused** is work that describes the systematic evaluation of a program/intervention/tool using qualitative, quantitative or mixed methods.
- **Non-Research Focused** is work that focuses primarily on the development or implementation of a program/initiative/tool.

PRESENTATION CATEGORIES:

Submissions can be made in the following presentation categories. Required elements for each category are below. The body of the abstract (excluding learning objectives and references) can be up to 300 words. All presentation types require at least one and no more than three learning objectives and references and a 50-word summary.

You are required to specify your preferred presentation format; however, the reviewers will make the final decision regarding presentation format.

PEER PAPER - COMPLETED

Each oral presentation will be 10 minutes, using a 6-slide presentation format* (what, why, how, outcomes, next steps and selected resources). Time will be allotted for thematic discussion across grouped presentations afterward.

*Six-slide presentation format:

1. What – describe the program, intervention or research project
2. Why – provide the background and rationale
3. How – describe how the program was developed, intervention undertaken or research conducted
4. Outcomes/Current State – share assessment, evaluation or research results, or describe the current state if an ongoing project/program
5. Next Steps/takeaways – offer information about future directions or key learning points that have emerged
6. Selected resources – list literature citations or other materials that have aided or will be helpful for further learning or replication

PEER PAPER - IN PROGRESS

Each oral presentation will be 10 minutes, using a 6-slide presentation format* (what, why, how, outcomes, next steps and selected resources). Time will be allotted for thematic discussion across grouped presentations afterward.

INTERACTIVE WORKSHOPS

Each workshop will be 60 minutes and requires a highly interactive Zoom component (at least 30 minutes of the workshop will be interactive).

INTERACTIVE POSTERS

Posters will be displayed in virtual rooms during an assigned 60-minute session. Presenters will be asked to give a 2-minute presentation and be available to answer questions once all presenters in a room have been presented.

ABSTRACT FORMAT

All abstracts must be submitted online. The abstract submission website will reopen on October, 2020, **and abstracts are due at 11:59pm on Friday, December 11th 2020.**

Student submissions are welcome and encouraged.

The following information must be included with your submission:

1. Title
2. Presentation Type (Research or Non-Research)
3. Presentation Category (Peer Paper - Completed, Peer Paper - In Progress, Workshop and Poster)
4. Primary Topic. You must select ONE primary topic.
5. Presenter Name(s) and affiliation(s). This is the person or people who will be **in attendance** and will make the presentation.
6. Co-Author Name(s) and affiliation(s).
7. Presentation Description (up to 300 words).
8. Presentation Summary (no more than 50 words; this is for inclusion in the program)
9. Learning Objectives (up to three).
10. References (up to three).
11. OPTIONAL – Elevator pitch (no more than 280 characters, including applicable twitter handle(s), links, and hashtag(s); this is for social media promotion)
