Jefferson (Philadelphia University + Thomas Jefferson University) is now one comprehensive, professional university – and the 5th largest in the city of Philadelphia. From Fashion and Interior Design to Medicine and Nursing and from Engineering and Architecture to Accounting and Biotechnology, Jefferson's 160 academic programs, spanning all degree levels, are designed to meet the needs of the modern professional world.

To further enhance the student experience, the University is making some changes to deliver on our mission, which is to "improve lives and provide students with exceptional value in 21st century professional education."

Effective July 1, 2018, the University will launch a new College of Rehabilitation Sciences and a College of Humanities and Sciences. The College of Health Professions will expand to add new programs and the College of Biomedical Sciences will be renamed the College of Life Sciences to better reflect its new portfolio of undergraduate and graduate programs.

"These changes represent a realignment of departments and programs from the College of Health Professions and the College of Science, Health and the Liberal Arts to optimize the academic experience for our students," said Stephen Spinelli, Jr., PhD, Chancellor, Jefferson.

"This move is advancing Jefferson's commitment to: integrate its offerings by aggregating similar programs under unified leadership; leverage our tremendous faculty talent across the University; accelerate our growth through synergies among educational offerings; and create unique models for transdisciplinary teaching and learning," noted Mark Tykocinski, MD, Vice Chancellor and Provost, Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs, and The Anthony F. and Gertrude M. DePalma Dean of Sidney Kimmel Medical College.

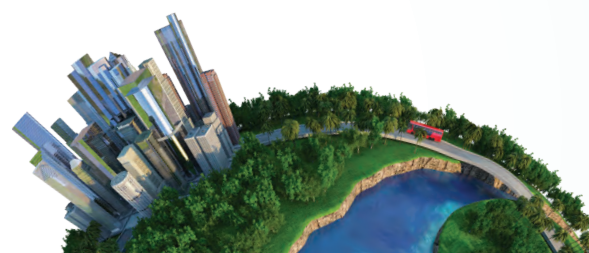

As a next step in our combination with Kennedy Health in New Jersey, Kennedy Health hospitals have been renamed as **Jefferson Cherry Hill Hospital**, **Jefferson Stratford Hospital**, and **Jefferson Washington Township Hospital**. And, to help the community recognize previous Aria – Jefferson Health locations in Northeast Philadelphia and Bucks County as Jefferson Health providers, we recently changed the name of these hospitals to **Jefferson Frankford Hospital**, **Jefferson Torresdale Hospital**, and **Jefferson Bucks Hospital**.



Thomas Jefferson University received several honors recently. Fashion Design at Jefferson has been ranked a top 10 program in the US by Fashionista, while Business of Fashion has ranked both our undergraduate and graduate fashion programs among the best in the world. Awards & Accreditations

- The NIH has awarded Thomas Jefferson University up to \$30M to develop a vaccine for Ebola and other viruses. In collaboration with other research institutions, private industry, and the US Government, Jefferson will develop a tetravalent vaccine (that can also protect against rabies) to defend against four viruses that can be fatal.
- Jefferson Health hospitals have received high patient safety marks from The Leapfrog Group.
 - Receiving an “A” grade: Thomas Jefferson University Hospital (including Jefferson Hospital for Neuroscience), Methodist Hospital, Abington – Lansdale Hospital, Aria Bucks County Hospital, Jefferson Cherry Hill Hospital, Jefferson Stratford Hospital and Jefferson Washington Township Hospital.
 - Receiving a “B” grade: Abington Hospital, Aria Frankford Hospital, and Aria Torresdale Hospital.
- The Healthcare Improvement Foundation presented patient safety awards to Jefferson Health hospitals. Thomas Jefferson University Hospitals received a *First Place Award* for the initiative entitled “Implementation of a Patient Blood Management Program”, Aria – Jefferson Health received a *Second Place Award* for “Progressive Mobility: Evidence Based Program Improves Outcomes in Critically Ill Patients.”
- Jefferson Health in New Jersey was honored with the *Innovation in Healthcare Award* by the Southern New Jersey Development Council.
- The Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania gave platinum-level recognition to Jefferson for its 2017 HAP Donate Life Hospital Challenge. Jefferson Health was given the recognition for its *Gift of Life Donor Program*; TJUH earned the designation for its *Center for Organ Recovery & Education (CORE)*. The following hospitals also received platinum status for the Gift of Life Donor Program: Abington – Jefferson Health; Abington Lansdale – Jefferson Health; Aria – Bucks County Hospital; Aria – Frankford Hospital; Aria – Torresdale Hospital; and Jefferson Hospital for Neuroscience/Thomas Jefferson University Hospital.

Brookings Institution Report: TJU #12 in US for Commercial Outcomes, #8 for Startups

In a new Brookings Institution national report on the commercial outcomes of downtown research universities, Jefferson ranked 12th best overall and 8th in the country for startups. The report, “Hidden in Plain Sight: The Oversized Impact of Downtown Universities,” provides evidence that Philadelphia and Jefferson are national powerhouses of innovation and entrepreneurship.

On a per-student basis, downtown universities outperform schools in the suburbs and rural areas in such economic drivers as licensing deals and income, number of inventions and startup creation, according to the report by the Anne T. and Robert M. Bass Initiative on Innovation and Placemaking at Brookings.

Developments

Discovery

- Second-line HIV drugs have the potential to work better when used together, but not for all patients. Now Jefferson researchers have discovered how that synergy might work, suggesting ways to develop better HIV drugs.
- A new study from the Sidney Kimmel Cancer Center at Jefferson, published in *Clinical Cancer Research*, demonstrated the feasibility of detecting cancer-associated gene mutations in circulating tumor cells isolated from patients — providing a powerful new tool for clinicians and cancer researchers.
- The American Association of Colleges of Osteopathic Medicine is sponsoring a groundbreaking nationwide project to study medical student empathy and its relationship to osteopathic medical education in collaboration with our Sidney Kimmel Medical College and Leonard Calabrese, DO, a professor of medicine at Cleveland Clinic Lerner College of Medicine.
- The brain's region for balance and movement is also involved in processing traumatic memories, say Jefferson researchers. The scientists found that Neuro Emotional Technique therapy at Jefferson, which activates the cerebellum, gives patients being treated for cancer and other long-term illnesses relief by diffusing a "bomb" on the "worst anxiety ever."
