PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Speech Language Pathology (MS-SLP) program is designed to provide diverse academic and clinical experiences in the field of communication sciences and disorders to ensure that graduates have the competencies to excel as independent clinicians and as members of collaborative clinical teams.

Full-time, 60 credits (2 years plus 1 summer session)

 The curriculum prepares students for the Certificate of Clinical Competence (CCC) as well as state licensure and school certification in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

 Students are engaged in community-based clinical practicum throughout their graduate program in order to gain "real world" experience with populations across the lifespan.

Pennsylvania Speech-Language-Hearing Association (PSHA)


