


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PROFESSION OVERVIEW

Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN):

- are credentialed healthcare professionals
- apply evidence-based information
- contribute to the health and wellness of individuals, groups, and communities



Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs) focus on:

- The use of nutrients in the human body
- All aspects surrounding the journey, utilization, and joy of eating food
- All types of people across the spectrum of health

In our program, students will be trained to *look beyond the disease* and see the *whole patient*. They will be required to examine the *disparities* in our health care system and consider how RDNs can help *combat these inequities*.

Accreditation

The Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) released the Future Education Model Accreditation Standards for programs in nutrition and dietetics. These accreditation standards integrate didactic coursework with supervised experiential learning in a competency-based curriculum designed to prepare nutrition and dietetics practitioners for future practice.

Thomas Jefferson University demonstrated its leadership in education by joining the third cohort of programs to be accredited by ACEND under these new standards.

Admissions Information

Prerequisite Coursework, Application Requirements, Application Deadlines



- - Anatomy and Physiology I and II
 - Biology
 - Biochemistry
 - Chemistry
 - Organic Chemistry
 - Microbiology
 - College Algebra or higher
 - Introduction to Nutrition (B or better)
 - Introduction to Psychology
 - Introduction to Statistics

Notes:

- All courses must be completed at time of enrollment
- C or better in all courses (except Nutrition)
- Labs are preferred for all sciences, but not required
- All prerequisites should be taken within 10 years of enrollment
- AP, IB, or CLEP credit may be considered on a case by case basis for prerequisites

Degree and GPA Requirements

- **Degree Prerequisite:** Applicants are required to have a Bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution prior to the start of the program (can be in progress at time of application)
 - Applicants seeking to gain advanced standing must have earned their bachelor's degree from an ACEND-accredited program

• GPA Requirements:

- Preferred minimum Cumulative GPA: 3.0
- Preferred minimum Prerequisite GPA: 3.0

How to Apply

- Online application via MyJefferson and \$50 application fee: my.jefferson.edu/apply
- **Transcripts:** official undergraduate and graduate transcripts from all regionally accredited institutions attended and/or from which credit was earned
- **Personal Statement:** addresses the prompt in the application
- 3 Letters of Recommendation: preferable from both academic sources (faculty, instructors) and professional sources (supervisors, managers, etc.)
- Résumé
- Prior Learning Portfolio (as applicable)

Deadlines

- Final application deadline: August 1st
- Completed applications reviewed on a rolling basis
- An interview with faculty is required

• Tuition (2021-22) is \$1,170 per credit plus \$1,810 annual fees

- Program is 54 credits total
- Scholarships available
- Admitted students may apply for financial aid
