- Online Application via MyJefferson: my.jefferson.edu/apply
- Transcripts from all colleges/universities attended
- 3 Letters of Recommendation (academic or professional)
- Evidence of English proficiency (as needed for international students)
- Evidence of recent (within last 5 years) graduate-level statistics course
- Personal statement that articulates research interests, career goals and insight into important issues in the profession
- Resume/CV
- Current active RN license (if applicable)

Admissions Timeline

- Application Deadlines

- Completed applications are reviewed on a rolling basis until the deadline
- Personal Interview with PhD in Nursing Faculty
- Decisions rendered in about 3 weeks
