- Official college transcripts from EVERY college or university attended
 - If you have completed fewer than 30 college credits or have not completed college algebra or a higher math, please send your final high school transcript and SAT or ACT scores for review
- One letter of recommendation
- Essay

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Application Requirements: International Students

In addition to the application materials listed, international applicants should submit:

- A course-by-course evaluation from a NACES-approved academic credential evaluation service.
- Proof of English proficiency
 - TOEFL
 - IELTS
 - Duolingo
 - English Composition I and II (grade of C) from a U.S. university
